Dear Parents / carers

Re: Year 10 students returning to school

We are very pleased to confirm that we will be welcoming back all students in September, following government guidelines. We hope you and your family are all safe and well. We also hope that you are looking forward to your child returning in September, as much as we are looking forward to welcoming our students back.

When your child returns they will be entering KS4, in most subjects the start of a two year course leading to their GCSE qualifications.

There have been some changes to the year team; Mrs Devine and Mrs McManus will still be with the team, Mr Morgan has been seconded to Foxford for a year and Mr Stokes is taking over this role in leading the year team. Miss Banwait has a new job closer to her home and will be replaced by Mr Davoile. As Year 10 students are now in KS4, their journey will be overseen by Mr Carter in place of Miss Roberts. All of these changes will help support our students through this crucial time in their education. These changes will also allow for slightly reduced numbers in each tutor group to enable even more personal support on a daily basis. You will be informed of these changes in the future.

We are very pleased to confirm that we will be welcoming back all students in September, following government guidelines. Our guiding principles for this are:

- a) to provide the best teaching experience when students return and ensure expectations of behaviour for learning remain high
- b) to continue to provide high quality professional development
- c) for staff to have a dedicated teaching space where possible
- d) for staff to have a demarcated and respected personal space within the classroom
- e) that relationships between students and staff are important and we will continue to nurture this
- f) to operate social distancing for all staff
- g) to continue to support staff well-being
- h) to grow from our experiences and use the skills we have developed to enhance our progress, particularly with blended learning
- i) for students to feel well supported in terms of their well-being
- j) to target resources to support our vulnerable students who have missed learning and are underachieving
- k) to offer our broad and balanced curriculum with some adaptations to meet need
- l) to minimise contact and maintain distance through implementing strict movement controls for students
- m) to keep year groups separate, particularly during unstructured time through zoning 'social areas'
- n) to work with our community to help the recovery plan see success
- o) to operate safe hygiene practices for all throughout the building and the school day
- p) to reduce flow throughout the school by staggering start and finish times for students
- q) to minimise queuing for break, lunch and toilets

In this letter, we aim to give you a sense of how the school will operate in order to be safe for everyone. We are in the process of compiling a parents' handbook which will give you full details regarding the measures that will be in place. In the meantime, please find below the information you will need in order to prepare your child for returning to school.

- Year 10 will return on **Tuesday 8 September 2020 and should arrive at school for 9.50am (period 2) on this day**. This is to allow for two days of full staff training in the first week, and to give the whole of the new Year 7 and 12, and Year 11, the opportunity to experience school.
- Start and finish times will vary by year, in order to maintain separation between year groups, as per government guidelines. After Tuesday 8 September, **Year 10 will start every day at 8.55am and will finish at 2.50pm**.
- Different year groups will also enter and leave the school by different entrances for the same reason. Year 10 will always use the entrance by the **amphitheatre**.
- Students should wear full uniform, in line with our usual expectations.
- Students need to ensure that they have all the equipment they will need with them, as teachers will not be able to hand out equipment, such as pens. As a school we will, in the first instance, provide a pencil case with the basic equipment of pen, pencil, eraser and ruler, for every student. Please ensure that your child has a suitable school bag for all items that he/she will need to bring to school.
- Students should also bring enough to drink, tissues and, if possible, personal hand sanitiser, with them for the day. Students will sanitise their hands at the beginning and end of every lesson. They will wash them, as per guidelines, every time they use the toilets. Please note that for hygiene reasons, water fountains will not be accessible upon our return.
- Lunch will be at different times, or in different areas for each year group. For Year 10 there will be no extended break in the morning and lunch will be at 12.10pm. Please be aware that there will be no food served/or available to purchase, except at lunchtime. Students will also have separately designated areas of the building/site for break and lunch.
- There will be an induction period for all students during lesson 2 on Tuesday 8 September, where they will learn about all of the new system.
- Lessons will begin following this induction period, with the aim of maintaining our usual broad and balanced curriculum.
- In order to allow the full curriculum to be delivered, arrangements for more controlled and staggered movement around the school will be in place.
- Our enhanced site cleaning regime will continue. The toilets are cleaned frequently and monitored to ensure a constant supply of soap. Hand driers are available, but paper towels are supplied where not, and bins are emptied regularly. Inspections of the site take place at regular intervals. Day cleaners frequently clean

toilet/hygiene areas and will also focus on door handles, push pads and pull handles. A reporting system is in place if additional areas need cleaning.

- The PE department have designed a lesson model that will halve the number of students using the changing facilities at any one time.
- Complying with safe behaviours at all times will be vital, in order to keep all students and staff safe, and will be tied to our behaviour policy

There is an expectation that all children will return to school, unless there are extreme health circumstances, as defined by government guidelines.
